

Seeking Licensed Psychologist to Join Growing Practice

Summary:

Boulder Center for Family and Behavioral Health (BCFBH) is seeking to hire a licensed outpatient child and family therapist in effort to increase our community members' access to high quality mental health services. The ideal candidate provides a flexible clinical approach, is fluent with cognitive behavioral therapies and skills-based interventions, and is experienced with providing family-based supports. Primary clinical services involve working with school-aged children (5-18), families, parent-training, and sometimes young adults (18-25).

BCFBH is a small private practice located in Boulder, CO who identifies with providing evidence-based therapies to children and their families. We promote a family-based approach to treatment (wherever appropriate) to create a therapeutic environment that fosters family communication, relationship, and support. Most common referral concerns include anxiety, depression, ADHD/executive functioning, emotion regulation, family relationships, and noncompliance.

A successful candidate:

- Is a Licensed Psychologist with an active license in good standing in the state of Colorado.
- Has completed an APA-accredited (or equivalent) training program in Clinical, Counseling, or School Psychology.
- Values a family-oriented approach to services wherever appropriate.
- Is clinically oriented toward cognitive behavioral therapies (CBT, DBT, ACT), behavioral skills training, parent training, and family systems therapy.
- Is independently driven to maintain collaborative relationships with community providers (e.g., pediatricians, neuropsychologists, psychiatrists, school counselors).
- Is capable of independently navigating their own caseload, hours, and clinical responsibilities.
- Values the independence and freedom of working in a private practice, as well as, the comaraderie and personal connection of working with a small and dedicated clinical team.
- Passionate Masters-level providers and postdoctoral candidates who fit job description are still encouraged to apply.

Roles and responsibilities:

- Provide outpatient therapy to identified patients and their families.
- Self-manage clinical availability, appointment scheduling, and taking payment for services.
- Collaborate with community providers to help maintain ongoing referrals and caseload.
- Participate in team meetings.
- Maintain clinical practices consistent with guidelines set forth by the APA and state of Colorado.
